Our New England spring has finally arrived, and the buds are bursting into bloom in and around the Hartshorne House. At this time of year, the gardens are truly lovely. It's easy to forget that during the time of Colonel James Hartshorne, the grounds around the house were the home of outbuildings serving the family's shoemaking business. There was probably a 'kitchen garden' for vegetables and herbs, but it's unlikely that the family's land would have been considered a garden. In 1890, when the Hartshorne family land (which then included Hartshorne Cove, now Vets Field) was sold to an ice harvesting company, the use of the property was strictly industrial. The views of Lake Quannapowitt were masked by the large wooden icehouses that literally ringed the lake.

When the town first purchased the Hartshorne House and decided to restore it as part of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' 300th anniversary celebration, the first task was to protect the structure itself, and its interior. After the Colonel James Hartshorne House Association was formed, it was the House 'hostess,' Mrs. Archibald Hume, who first recognized the potential in the outdoor space.

Grace and Archibald Hume were the very first House Residents. As an avid gardener, Mrs. Hume began tending to the house grounds and set out, little by little, to cultivate perennials and flowering plants. How pleased she would be to see the grounds today, as they flourish under the loving attention of today's House Residents, Ariel and Tyler Gaudet.

Over the years the gardens have been enhanced with flowering trees and plants, dedicated to the memory of past Hartshorne House Association directors and family. A new flagpole, patio and other donations help make the grounds more memorable. One of the latest additions is a striking 'historic' stone bench for the comfort of passersby to pause and enjoy historic Church Street and the view of the Hartshorne House and gardens. The bench, donated by a Wakefield business, Olde New England Granite, was fashioned from granite salvaged from the Longfellow Bridge.

The house's gardens make the property a perfect venue for gatherings, receptions, showers and weddings. If you are planning an event, please consider the Hartshorne House. The first floor and gardens are available for rental for a very reasonable fee, and all proceeds from rentals help to preserve and protect the old house that stands in the heart of the gardens.
